meat must be kept.






Dogs may not be used to hunt deer in Texas. Except for some East Texas counties, however, not more than two dogs may be used to trail a wounded deer that has left a blood trail.

Deer hunters in Lampasas County are reminded about the antler restrictions in place. A legal buck is defined

as having a hardened antler protruding through the skin, and at least one unbranched antler or an inside spread measurement between main beams of at least 13 inches.

Bag limit for deer in Lampasas County is not more than four -- two bucks and two antlerless. But only one buck may have an inside spread of 13 inches or greater.

	<p>DOVE General Season: Sept. 1-Oct. 30 and Dec. 26-Jan. 4. Daily bag limit: 12 mourning, white-winged and white-tipped doves, to include not more than 2 white-tipped. Possession limit: twice the daily limit.</p>
	<p>QUAIL General Season: Oct. 25-Feb. 22. Daily bag limit: 15 quail. Possession limit: 45 quail.</p>

DEFINITION OF A POINT



LEGAL POINT **NOT A POINT**

A point is a projection that extends at least one inch from the edge of a main beam or another tine. The tip of the main beam is also a point.
