

# A walk in the park - Lometa style

The 88-acre Lometa Regional Park plays host to everything from family picnics to musical concerts, as well as rodeos and the popular Diamondback Jubilee.

It offers a variety of facilities including baseball and soccer fields, a fishing pond, barbecue grills, 12 spaces for recreational vehicles, a bath house with showers and restrooms, paved parking, playground equipment and picnic shelters.
