Jail sentence given in possession of drug case

Springlake resident Antonio Padilla, 33, received nine years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Institutional Division for possession of a controlled substance over four grams and under 200 grams. He was credited with jail time served and must pay \$140 in restitution.

The sentence was handed down in recent 27th District Court action.

Nicole Elizabeth Brinkley, 25, of Lampasas was given three years' probation for driving while intoxicated with a child under 15. She must pay \$431.34 to the Copperas Cove Police Department and a \$1,000 fine, and her driver's license was suspended for six months.

Melissa Sullivan, 45, of Odessa had her probation amended to attend a substance abuse program. She is charged with possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver.

Probation for Elizabeth Sanchez Barton, 77, of Lampasas was extended one year on her charge of criminal solicitation.

Sept. 18 arraignments are on the docket for Paul Rivera, 25, of Brownfield for driving while intoxicated, third or more; and Adam Trejo, 19, of Lometa for manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance under one gram.

Pretrial hearings are scheduled Sept. 18 for William Charles Andrews, 28, of Mineral Wells for possession of a controlled substance and Ronald Allen Bascom, 62, of Cherokee for forgery of a financial instrument.

An Oct. 9 arraignment is on tap for Wayne Josef Hatchell, 41, of Lampasas. He is charged with possession of marijuana over four ounces and under five pounds.

Pretrial hearings are set Oct. 9 for David Lee Rudd, 30, of Burnet for theft over \$1,500 and under \$20,000; Coy Dustin Dowdle, 30, of Briggs for driving while intoxicated and felony repetition; Christopher Sean Cowen, 36, of Copperas Cove for driving while intoxicated, third or more; Jill Bowen Burrows, 37, of Richland Springs

for driving while intoxicated with a child under 15; and Landon William Dalton, 18, of Lampasas for burglary of a habitation.

Arraignment is slated Oct. 16 for Byron Dean Ball, 37, of Lampasas on a charge of possession of a controlled substance under one gram.

Paul Oneal Potter, 30, faces an Oct. 16 adjudication hearing for harassment of a public servant.

On a charge of driving while intoxicated and felony repetition, Norberto Perez Carranza, 49, of Lometa faces a punishment hearing Oct. 23.

Peggy Renelle Mixon, 38, of Lometa is set to enter a plea Oct. 23 for driving while intoxicated with a child passenger under 15.

For manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance, Ryan Allenlogan Pyles, 19, of Kempner is set for a Nov. 16 jury trial.

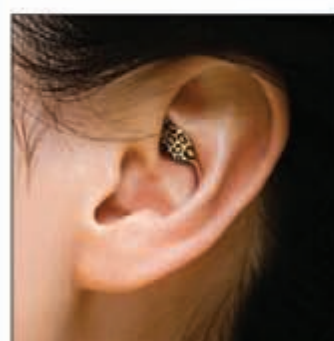
